Member Spotlight

Rev. Dr. Lawrence O. Swain began as an area minister for the Pittsburgh Baptist Association in 1995. Larry then served as the region's Executive Minister from 1998 to 2004. He accepted the position of Executive Minister of the **American Baptist Churches of Ohio** in 2004 and functioned in this role until his retirement in 2015. As part of his responsibilities, Larry also served on the ABF Board of Directors, as the President of the *Multi-Region Corporation (MRC)*.



The Multi-Region Corporation (MRC)

The *Multi-Region Corporation (MRC)* is composed of 28 American Baptist regional organizations across the United States. These regions assist local congregations by providing such services as conferences and workshops, conflict resolution, camping ministries, new church planting, and ministerial guidance and support. Along with *American Baptist Home Mission Societies* (ABHMS) and *American Baptist International Ministries (IM)*, MRC functions as one of ABF's three supported members.

Explaining the vital link between regional ministries and the Foundation, Larry says, "The Foundation is the vehicle that enables the important stewardship issue of planned giving to be communicated and delivered to local congregations. This means that ABF allows regions to provide estate planning services and instruments to churches without having to establish their own offices, which saves regional mission dollars." For instance, the software that manages trusts and annuities on the donors' behalf can cost approximately \$35,000 per year. This multiplied by the 28 regions clearly demonstrates good financial stewardship provided through regions being part of the MRC." ABF's existence allows this and other economics of scale to be realized, resulting in substantial savings for each member.

As a consequence of retiring as the Executive Minister for *ABC of Ohio*, Larry also concluded his tenure as President of the MRC. "I've appreciated my tenure as president of the *Multi-Region Corporation* because I've had the opportunity to see first-hand how ministries near and far are supported through the ways the Foundation purposely and dependably administers funds entrusted to its care. I've also developed a growing appreciation for planned giving. Individuals and congregations, understandably, often focus on immediate needs. However, ABF serves as a unique platform to remind us to go beyond the here and now — to seriously plan for the long-term future of God's kingdom."



2015 Multi-Region Corporation, Food Pantry Expansion of Services, First Baptist Churches Council Bluffs, IA.

With God's favor and devotion to ministry, the food pantry for First Baptist Church in Council Bluffs, IA has blossomed from a small ministry capable of feeding a few people monthly to become the largest food pantry in their area. This ministry now serves over 8,000 people each year, providing both physical and spiritual food to individuals and families in need. Pastor David Bender and Teresa Hildreth, the food pantry coordinators for the past 15 years, have witnessed the positive impact the program has had on the community; however, they recognized that much more still needed to be accomplished.

As part of their partnership with the Mid-American Region, where Dr. Marshall E. Peters serves as Executive Minister, the church submitted an application for a Palmer Grant in 2015. They received an award to assist in the following areas:

- Volunteer and client training
- Communication literature and website
- Fundraising efforts

Advancements in these areas will provide greater sustainability and allow improved coordination of services with other community organizations. "Our goal is to see our clients better their lives," Hildreth says, "so perhaps at some point they will no longer need our services." Funding American Baptist programs such as these is what Virginia and Gordon Palmer had in mind when they established this granting program through American Baptist Foundation. We look forward to seeing how God will continue to bless this ministry and all the lives that are blessed due to their outreach.

2015 Financial Summary Pre-audit

During our thirty years of ministry, *American Baptist Foundation (ABF)* has managed charitable trusts, gift annuities, endowments, donor advised funds, investment accounts, and other planned giving assets. A long tenure of prudent administration and investment management continues to help ensure that the needs of our donors, members, and other American Baptist (AB) partners in ministry and mission are met. Note the following financial highlights for 2015.

- \$124.2 million in total assets under management
- \$7.1 million in income distributions to our donors and income beneficiaries
- \$3.3 million in final distributions to ministries


Life Income Agreements

Life income agreements allow donors to establish gifts that also produce income for themselves or designated individuals, usually for life. At the end of 2015, ABF managed agreements included:

Charitable Trusts – 96 trusts managed totaling \$23.7 million

Charitable Gift Annuities (CGAs) – 413 CGAs managed with \$8 million held in reserves

Other Agreements Managed for AB Partners – 56 accounts totaling \$817,753




Investments and Endowments

ABF's investment and endowment platform consists of three active and professionally managed investment options. Total investment and endowment assets managed as of December 31, 2015 were \$92.5 million, including \$87.6 million specific to the investment and endowment platform.



During the year, 17 new accounts were added to the investment and endowment platform. A total of \$3.8 million in new contributions were received for new and existing accounts. In a challenging investment climate, the 2015 Fixed, Blended and Stock portfolio returns were 0.72%, -2.19% and -2.82%, respectively — finishing below their respective benchmarks of 1.07%, -0.79%, and -2.27%. 2015 International Ministries: Youth Leadership Development Project (YLDP)

In 2015, the Ethiopian Addis Kidan Baptist Church received a Palmer Grant to expand the Youth Leadership Development Project (YLDP) into Ethiopia. Despite having an abundance of natural resources, millions of Ethiopians are suppressed by extreme poverty and illiteracy. In addition to environmental challenges — poor governance, corruption, and political instability are contributing factors to the country's hardships. Leadership needs to be addressed at all levels and YLDP aims to nurture the holistic development of future leaders. Rev. Beletew Kebede, General Secretary of the church, stated that "as Christians, we must be the light of the world. In our case, our youth must be the light of our communities across our nation."

YDLP aims to refresh Ethiopia's youth by instilling Biblical standards through leadership training. Secularism is dominating the youth in Ethiopia, therefore the church must play an active role to counteract this reality. Through YLDP, six training centers will be established throughout the country, including capital city of Addis Ababa. Multi-day training sessions will be held. Areas of training will include:

- Leadership skills and character development
- Christian ethics
- Stewardship
- Self-discipline

YLDP's initial goal is to train 112 youth potential leaders-- 56 male and 56 female. Accomplishments will be evident when the young people transition from passive observers, to active participants and decision makers in the life of the church, their communities and the nation at large. YDLP hopes that funding from this ABF grant award will help to establish a foundation that will transform this vision into a reality.
